On Thursday, November 14<sup>th</sup>, the Themes 2 Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee and the Theme Advisory Group for Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World reviewed a GEN Theme: CDJW with Interdisciplinary and Integrated Collaborative Teaching High-Impact Practice request for German/Slavic/South Asia Studies 3456.

The reviewing faculty approved the request with the following feedback:

- Comment: The reviewing faculty are unclear on the connection between *Avengers*: Endgame and the core topics of the course. They feel that it may be more effective to replace it with a film that directly aligns with the course and Theme ELOs.
- Comment: The reviewing faculty would like to commend the departments for what they
  view as a highly engaging and interesting course taught by an exceptional team of
  instructors.
- Comment: The reviewing faculty request that the departments include a brief note in the
  curriculum.osu.edu course description indicating that the course is team-taught by
  multiple instructors. Including this information will ensure that the HIP aspect of the
  course is established for future offerings in order to always satisfy the HIP designation
  should the instructors change. Please note that the departments can work with ASCCAS
  staff to make this adjustment without delaying the approval process.

If the departments are comfortable, they can provide me with the note that they would like to add to the course descriptions in curriculum.osu.edu that addresses the third comment above, and I will gladly make the change without having to exchange courses back and forth between queues. Otherwise, I can return the courses to the department queues in order to address the comment. Please let me know at your earliest convenience how you would like to proceed.
