Good afternoon,

On Monday, Dec. 9th, the Themes I Subcommittee of the ASC Curriculum Committee and the Theme Advisory Group for Traditions, Cultures, and Transformations reviewed a course proposal for History 2220 to be included in the GEN Theme: Traditions, Cultures, and Transformations category.

The reviewing faculty unanimously approved the request with two contingencies and one recommendation:

- **The reviewing faculty ask that the course title be changed to remove the word “Introduction” from the title to better reflect the new, advanced nature of the course. They recommend, based on the current title, to rename the course to “History of Christianity”.**
- **The reviewing faculty are unclear how students will be provided an explicit opportunity to engage in self-reflexive learning and fulfill GEN Theme ELO 2.2 based upon the assignment descriptions on pages 6-8 of the syllabus. They would like to see a specific assignment that will allow students an opportunity to fulfill ELO 2.2.**
- *The reviewing faculty recommend that the course instructor articulate, within the course syllabus, a few more connections between GEN ELOs and course assignments to better allow students to understand how the course assessments will allow them to achieve the appropriate outcomes.*

As a reminder, **contingencies** (in bold above) must be addressed and resubmitted via curriculum.osu.edu before this course can move forward in the approval process to OAA. *Recommendations* (in italics above) should be implemented when the course is next taught. I will return History 2220 to the department queue via curriculum.osu.edu in order to address the reviewing faculty’s requests.
