Dear ASC Curriculum Committee,

The American Sign Language Studies minor was first approved in 2020. Over the past couple years, the ASL Program has grown exponentially. The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee approved the ASL major, ASL Access, Equity, and Inclusion along with seven new courses. We established OSU's relationship with the Study Abroad for Deaf and Signers in Siena, Italy. Three additional courses were approved by the ASCC as part of the recently approved post-baccalaureate ASL Elementary-Level Teaching Certificate, run by the newly established Center for ASL and Deaf Equity. The instructional staff numbers have doubled, an Associate Professor (serving 50% in the ASL Program/Center for ASL and Deaf Equity and 50% in Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies) was hired, and three additional Lecturer hires are approved over the next two academic years. A Director of Undergraduate Studies, Language Director, and Assistant to the Language Director have been appointed within the ranks.

The increasingly rich experiences afforded by these new initiatives and courses, leads to today's revision request for the ASL Studies Minor Advising Sheet to reflect the new coordinating advisor contact information, new courses available to students and removal of courses no longer offered by the Center for Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.

Students who have already declared the minor will not be negatively impacted. By adding new elective options (ASL3104, ASL3650, ARTSSCI5797), students have greater flexibility in completing the minor. Only one of three current required core courses is changing; ASL3350 will now be an elective, allowing students to count it toward their minor. This is the only ASL listed course that is currently taught 100% in English. Students who choose not to take this course since it is now an elective will still be able to meet the stated goals of the minor which include "creating professionals who can utilize ASL relevant to their field, create direct interactions with local Deaf communities, as well as generate opportunities for research currently unexplored."

We appreciate the College and the Curriculum Committee for their ongoing support. The ASL Program is thrilled to continue the momentum and provide innovative programming for the university.

The 12 credit hour American Sign Language (ASL) Studies Minor will add to undergraduates major field of study by creating professionals who can utilize ASL relevant to their field, create direct interactions with local Deaf communities, as well as generate opportunities for research currently unexplored.

The ASL Studies Minor consists of 12 hours of course work beyond 1103. All courses are three credits unless otherwise indicated. All students must take the three (3) required core courses and then select one (1) course from the list of elective courses.

- **ASL 3350**: American Deaf Arts and Literature (3)

- CLLC 3301.01S: Intercultural Competence for Global Citizenship (2)\*

- **CLLC 3302S**: Intercultural Competence for Global Citizenship After School Program (3)
- CLLC 5100: Introduction to Community Interpreting

- ENGLISH 2277: Introduction to Disability Studies (3)
- LING 2000: Introduction to Linguistics (3)

\*CLLC 3301.01 and CLLC 3301.02 must be taken together to meet elective course requirements.

### **ASL Studies Minor Program Guidelines**

The following guidelines govern the minor.

<u>Credit hours required:</u> A minimum of 12. 1000-level course work shall not count towards the minor.

<u>Transfer and EM credit hours allowed</u>: A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE: A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

## Overlap with the major and additional minor(s):

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

#### Grades required:

- Minimum C- for a course to be counted towards the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of course work graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor.

X193 credits: No more than 3 credit hours.

Minor approval: Department approval is not required as long as student completes courses exactly as indicated on minor program description. Course substitutions are not permitted. Minor may be declared with student's assigned academic advisor

<u>Filing the minor program form</u>: The department does not require that a Minor Program Form be completed. The degree audit report (DAR) certifies the minor. If the minor is not complete on the DAR the student must consult with a the American Sign Language Program.

<u>Changing the minor</u>: Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by ASL Studies Minor advisor.
