It was nice to see you again at the Bookends event last week. I had a question about the content of 5600 that I'm hoping you might know the answer to, specifically with regard to the Biology course that I sent requesting concurrence. If we refocused the course on the role of biotechnology in evolutionary medicine,

would we alleviate the concern of overlap? I don't see a lot of that content in the 5600 syllabi. Specifically, I'm thinking about CRISPR and its role both directly influencing human health and in xenotransplantation, among similar topics.

Of course, I will be certain to send a syllabus back for review, but before I start digging in too deeply, I wanted to make sure this was a safe area without too much overlap.
