## Comparative Studies 315: Change to 500-level

(cont. #6)

## Statement of proposed change.

Comparative Studies 315, "Women and Religion," has been revised as a 500-level course and renamed "Gender, Sexuality, and Religion." The title change better reflects revision that had already taken place in 315, which had involved moving beyond the essentialization of women's religious experience in order to emphasize and explore intersections of gender, sexuality, and religion. While the focus of 315 has evolved, it has remained cross-cultural and comparative in scope, with sections of the course devoted to different religious traditions—Islam, Christianity, Buddhism, and others.

The proposed change of level from 315 to 515 is therefore less related to a change in content, and more to the number and sophistication of reading and writing assignments. In the higher level course, for example, rather than writing three 5-page papers, students will complete considerably more writing through different kinds of assignments (analytical summaries, midterm, final paper and oral presentation). Similarly, themes that are the focus of 315 will be explored in greater depth in the higher level course.
