Ohio professionals (e.g., ESL teachers, social workers, health professionals) have expressed enormous interest in learning about recent immigrants and other Hispanics they are called on to work with, but coursework available in our department (e.g., SPANISH 689) is taught in Spanish and tailored largely to undergraduate majors. The proposed course is geared to a non-traditional audience in both its format (e.g., it will most likely be offered on Saturdays) and its content (e.g., cultural issues of professional interest).
